



Your attention shifts from the sky to the sea for the returning gray whales who have traveled 5,000 miles north from their winter in Baja. There will also be sea otters, Steller sea lions, harbor seals, puffins, eagles, and seabirds. The salty smells, cold sprays of water, and guttural sounds are unforgettable.

As one who inspired generations to be off the beaten path, John Muir explored Yosemite afoot: hiking mountain trails, walking among giant sequoias, and wandering through a waterfall mist. Abraham Lincoln declared Yosemite our nation's first-ever protected parkland in 1864, eight years before Yellowstone was the first officially designated national park.

Your eyes will open wider to see the grandeur of Muir's beloved Sierras. Wellplanned hikes open new perspectives into this much-photographed granitehewn valley. You'll be at landmarks like El Capitan, Half Dome, and Yosemite Falls. You'll also hike the less-known Tioga Road to Tuolumne Meadows or wind over to glacial Hetch Hetchy Valley where the peaks might hold snow above and wildflowers below.

In the presence of the magnificent ancient sequoias, you might want to sit awhile with pen and paper and let yourself unfurl. Like Muir himself said, "Another glorious Sierra day..."





The magic of Yellowstone takes on an entirely different hue in winter. Frozen waterfalls hang in icy sculptures. Sulfur-scented steam hangs over blue and orange hot springs. You'll see why artists use a lot of blue in winter as you watch the light across miles of glittering open spaces blanketed in deep, deep snow.

Winter is an ideal time for wildlife-watching: no crowds. Snow pushes animals to lower elevations, and the quiet surrounds you on your way to Old Faithful Snow Lodge. Bison shovel snow with their huge heads to find buried grass. You might see elk, wolves, foxes, and raptors. Take advantage of cross-country skis or snowshoes to explore trails to hidden geysers.

The trip ends at legendary Chico Hot Springs. At last you get to soak in the healing geothermal waters and enjoy fine dining, Montana-style.



Then shift to Valparaíso's maze of steep, sinuous streets filled with poets and painters. Next, discover the Atacama Desert's stony pinnacles and salt lakes. Continue to the Valle de la Luna nature sanctuary, evocative of the moon. Meet the sunrise at the Tatio Geysers for a mystical introduction to the steaming mud pots. Take a rejuvenating thermal hot-springs soak. Pass through Andean villages and stunning alpine lagoons on the way to Uyuni Salt Flats. Be astonished by Incahuasi's century-old giant cacti filling the landscape. Last, gaze at the Arbol de Piedra, a stone formation wrought from wind and sand and time into the shape of a tree.
